LEWIS UNIVERSITY – COLLEGE OF EDUCATION PROGRAM COMPLETERS SURVEY 2013-2014 Summary of Data

The College of Education surveys all the candidates who are in the process of completing a graduate or undergraduate program leading to a licensure from the College of Education or the College of Arts and Sciences. The purpose of the survey is to inform the unit of graduating candidates' perceptions about how well they have been prepared to conduct their jobs as future teachers or other school personnel. Survey questions can be categorized in three sections, academic, process and procedures from admission to completion of the program, and candidates' demographics.

In the area of academic survey questions seek graduating candidates' perceptions of their preparation in the following areas:

- Teaching, leadership, and the wellbeing and advancement of K-12 students
- Working effectively with students, their families, and the community of their school
- Ability to attend and educate students with special needs and marginalized individuals
- Command of knowledge and ease in using technology to enhance their instruction and leadership
- Knowledge and ability to perform assessment and apply the resulted data to inform their teaching and leadership
- Awareness and ability to demonstrate dispositions needed to facilitate the education and learning of all students
- Feeling prepared to present themselves as professional, ethical, and knowledgeable members of the society
- And last but not least applying the mission of the University through their performance and dispositions.

(Questions 1 through 25)

Summary of Data

The survey also seeks graduating candidates' overall perceptions of the process and procedures applied to all aspects of their preparations. Questions pertain to their satisfaction with admission, advisement, instruction, resources (library and technology), and evaluation of the mentoring and assistance that they received during field experiences, clinical practice, practicum, and internships. (Questions 26-41)

Finally, the survey completes with some questions about demographics about the participants. (Questions 41-45) The last two questions inquires about the length of time it took for them to complete the degree and whether or not they are interested in another degree.

In academic year of 2013-2014 ninety (90) graduating students completed the survey. Candidates responding to the survey were from four programs, elementary education, secondary education, Special Education, Reading, Instructional Technology, and School Counseling. Sixty eight (68) candidates were completing the initial and twenty two (22) were completing the advanced programs of Instructional Technology, Reading, and School Counseling.

In response to the first cluster of questions about their academic and professional preparations the majority of candidates rated their experience as Satisfied or Very Satisfied. Range of satisfaction varied from 100% at the highest and 82.2% at the lowest, with a median of 95.6%. Candidates seemed most satisfied with their "Ability to understand and build upon the developmental levels of students with whom I work," and "understanding of the importance of diversity in teaching and learning" and finally "demonstration of dispositions that value fairness and learning by ALL students." 100% of candidates rated these questions as satisfied or very satisfied which indicates their perception of their education and preparation at Lewis University.

Candidates rated their dissatisfaction with different aspects of their education ranging from 13.3% at the highest and 0% at the lowest. The area of highest dissatisfaction was related to the "experience of integrating different types of technology into the classroom experience." This opinion was expressed mainly by candidates from special education and elementary education. Results were shared with the program faculty who can address the concern in their program meetings.

Participants' perception of the process, instruction, resources, advisement, and the supervisory role was overall very positive too. The majority of candidates rated their experience with the process and procedure as Satisfied or Very Satisfied, ranging from 100% at the highest and 82.2% at the lowest. The median for their responses was 91.1%. Candidates were 100% satisfied with "the attitude conveyed by the faculty to them as an aspiring professional "and" overall quality of their program."

Range of dissatisfaction of the candidates with the processes and procedures varied from 11.1% at the highest to 0% at the lowest level. The rating of 11.1% was in response to the question of "availability of the courses needed in the program." The response came mainly from candidates completing the special education and secondary education program. Data was presented to the program chairs for discussion in their meetings.

Demographic questions indicated that the majority, 70, of participants were female, 16 male and 4 individuals did not respond to the question about gender. Candidates came from a variety of backgrounds, a few stated that they had a disability, and the age range varied between 21 and 51 years old. 74.4% of candidates stated that they would be interested in pursuing another degree from Lewis University.
